1) **The Beginning of the School Day**

All children are to arrive promptly for registration, to be ready and settled for their first lesson.

8:30am	School gates open
8:50am	Registration
3.00pm	All children will be dismissed onto the playground by their class teacher

2) **Break Times**

Break time will be at 10.30. We ask the children to bring in a healthy snack Monday – Thursday. On Friday children may bring a snack of their choice or buy a fair trade product from our tuck shop. Drinking water will be available in class. Cups are provided at all times.

3) **Uniform and PE kit**

Uniform – All uniform is to be smart and labelled with either a pen or tag. School shoes are to be black, no heels or trainers and white or grey socks. Shirts and ties are to be worn from 31st October 2016. Shirts are to be tucked in. Long hair is to be tied back at all times.

PE Kit – The correct school PE kit is to be worn. Correctly fitted plimsolls are required for indoors, trainers for outdoors. Please provide your child with a tracksuit for the colder months of the year. Please put your child's name on everything.

4) **Expectations of standard of work within the classroom relating to targets, parental support and positive attitude**

Library books, reading books and logs are to be treated with care. Children are expected to read every night. Parents are asked to support

their children fully with their homework and reading and maths activities. A positive attitude towards work at all times is expected within the school. There is a high expectation for the presentation and standard of work produced; each child to work to the best of their own ability.

5) **Homework Requirements**

- (i) Children are expected to read for 20 minutes each night and record the pages read in their reading log.
- (ii) An English homework sheet, when set, will be given out on a Friday.
- (iii) Spelling - children will have differentiated daily practice in class using the LSCWC (Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check) method. Parents will be informed of the weekly spellings in order to support their child.
- (iv) Maths will be given out daily to be worked on for approximately 10 minutes a night. The knowledge of times tables will be tracked and tested in class periodically.

6) **Other Information**

- A senior member of staff, or office staff, will always be available for any emergency or serious concern.
- The happiness of your child is paramount to us. If you have any worries or concerns about your child please contact the School Office to arrange an appointment to see a class teacher. As a school, we believe that dialogue between parents and teacher is important.
